

July 31st Update

The State of California has continued to see an increase in COVID cases and is diligently watching 32 counties on their watch list. Gratefully, Nevada County is not one of the counties on the watch list, however this could change at a moment's notice. Currently there are no new restrictions applicable to the park except what is stated in previous updates.

The following are updates on specific restrictions, plans and operations:

Temporary Management Team

Currently TTT has hired a previous management team to take over the operations of the park while we look for a new manager and assistant manager team. Laura and Robert Hyde have agreed to help us through this transition and will remain till the park closes in October. They have been in the park for little over a week now and are getting up to speed on the status of the park. Please allow them time to acclimate and get the park operating smoothly. Also, please take the time to welcome and thank them for graciously accepting our plea for help.

Manager, Assistant Manager and Staff

We are currently accepting applications for Assistant Manager and will be scheduling interviews in the coming weeks. Once we have hired an Assistant Manager, we will start looking for a Manager and Senior Clerk to manage the park. Robert and Laura will be training the Manager and Assistant Manager so we will be in good shape for the winter and next summer season.

When our last management team left a few weeks ago, two camp worker couples left as well. We are no longer at full staffing levels and will be looking to hire replacements for the two work camper couples that left. Operations and services currently offered will remain as they are until Robert can evaluate the staff and determine if any changes are needed to services or operations.

Bears

We have at least 3-4 bears roaming in the park. They are getting bolder and visit the park on a regular basis. Please remember to securely latch the dumpsters down during both the day and night as the bears have figured how to get into the dumpsters when not securely latched. **Please do not give them a reason to stay!**

Please remember to keep your sites clean, coolers stored out of site, food stored in airtight containers and trash removed from your site nightly and deposited in our latched park dumpsters.

Lastly, **PLEASE BE VIGILANT AND DILIGENT IN BEING AWARE OF YOUR SURROUNDINGS.** There have been several close encounters with these bears,

and we do not want anyone to be hurt. Please do not gather to watch the bears, rather make noise and scare these bears out of the park. We do not want them in our park! If they continue to come around, especially in the fall, there is a high likelihood they will try and get into our members trailers looking for food. In addition, if the bears are deemed a nuisance, the Department of Wildlife will not relocate them rather, they will terminate them. I do not want anyone to be hurt nor do I want the bears hurt. **Again, please do not give the bears any reason to come and visit our park and please make noise and scare them out of our park when you see them.**

Laundry Appointment only between 9am-5pm daily

Dumpsters 9am-10pm daily – locked at 10pm

Please remember to latch down the lids on the dumpsters to deter animals from entering and tearing up the trash. We have had some recent activity and would like to address it now, so we do not have a bigger issue in the future.

Office Open for member business (Calls Only) and gate entry from 9am-5pm and gate entry only 5pm-10pm daily

Propane Tanks filled daily at 9am

Honey Wagon Tuesdays and Thursdays – Please call office to schedule

Golf Cart Charging Normal operations

Water Water system fully operational for members use

Campfires Campfires are allowed per management evaluation of local weather conditions and Fire agencies recommendations or directives

Gate The entry gate has been repaired and normal operations have resumed. Member's first visit will still require manual operation of the gate with activation of members gate passes for future entry.

Site Inspections Site improvement and site sales inspections are ongoing and are handled on a first come first serve basis.

Potential Buyers Potential buyers may enter the park per the rules outlined in the June 12, 2020 update and posted on the Membership for Sale webpage.

Comfort Stations Currently 6 comfort stations are open. Future openings are dependent on available employees and demand.

- Contractors Licensed contractors and vendors with business licenses will be allowed in the park on a limited basis. (snow roofs, trailer moving/removal, RV repairs, etc.) Please contact the office to schedule access.
- Material Deliveries Material deliveries by vendors can resume but need to be approved by the manager and access scheduled with the office.
- Ice At this time ice will not be available for sale in the park.
- Golf Carts Please remember not to leave your golf cart at the charging stations for more than 24 hours to allow other members the opportunity to charge their carts.
