

## May 29<sup>th</sup> Update

The Park was very busy over the Memorial Day weekend and I appreciate all the cooperation our Members have shown during this very difficult time. Nevada County is currently in Stage 2 of the State of California's re-opening plan and hopefully, as they move into the next stage, we too will be able to relax some of the restrictions in the park. As we are seeing across the country, some people want all restrictions lifted while others want them to stay in effect for a longer period of time. The right answer is probably somewhere in the middle.

The Board and Management have been in touch with both the state and county health departments and their respective guidance is directing our decisions. I have also spoken with our attorney, as it is his job to advise and defend the association as needed. There were basically three options for the board to consider:

- Fully open facilities despite stay-at-home orders
- 
- Work within the state and county guidelines to open the park with restrictions and wait until state and county restrictions are lifted to fully open the park
- 
- Open the park with no services and keep all facilities closed until all restrictions are lifted

The board chose to work within the state and county guidelines and wait until restrictions are modified or lifted, so we can legally open facilities demonstrating we have made decisions to protect the association, its members, and employees while following guidelines established by the respective health departments.

Like all businesses, we need to consider the best way to open our facilities and still protect everyone. We are working on those plans as we wait for the county to lift restrictions. It is our hope it will happen soon.

In the meantime, I ask for your continued patience and understanding as we work through what can be done. A hasty decision could cost the association and all the members a substantial sum over and above the annual dues. I will continue to post an update each Friday until the park resumes normal operations.
