SPECIAL MESSAGE TO OUR MEMBERS

I want to thank you for your patience and understanding during this crisis in our country. The Board and Management have tried to consider all areas of concern and make plans that protect everyone in our park. As you know, in addition to the federal orders, the Governor and Nevada County have also issued orders for all businesses and the public to follow. Balancing all of this has been a real challenge.

While we have received support from most of our Members, there are some having a difficult time with the delay until June 1st. Primarily these are our "snowbirds" leaving the lower states as the temperatures rise and traveling to TTT. They have no place to stay until the park opens. We have decided to allow Members to move in and self-isolate on their sites beginning on May 15th. If you choose to do this, please know there will be no services available until June 1st. Please be sure to fill your propane and water tanks before arriving at TTT. Also, empty all of your holding tanks because the dump stations will not be available. We will also allow RVs to be dropped off on your site, so you don't have to continue to pay storage. We believe this doesn't violate the current orders nor future orders as the economy begins to open. We ask that you not approach any of our employees to keep everyone safe. Instead, please call the office if you have any questions (530) 587-4023.

We hope water will be available earlier than June 1st, but there is no guarantee. Our Managers are working on the water system as it is their number one priority. Seasonal employees are working on cleaning the roads. Not all of them have arrived, so it is slow cleaning 7.2 miles of road. Before Members connect to the water system, thoroughly inspect water lines on the site to be sure they are clean. Any lines that remained connected over the winter, may be plugged and any sediment could be forced into your RV.

Our Managers Dave and Andy are to be thanked for all they have endured this winter and still continued to work outside on the needed repairs. The water breaks were due to the age of the underground pipes and valves that finally broke in a couple of locations aided by below zero temperatures causing additional breaks. As they continue to make repairs, the next step is inspection by the water master and taking water samples throughout the park. Once all the inspections are complete and the water tests pass Nevada County requirements, then water will be available for the Members. Regular updates will continue on Fridays.
