



Volunteers for Spring Pine Needle Cleanup

- I. It is the Park Manager's responsibility to determine if TTT Member volunteers would be helpful in cleaning up pine needles before the Park's official opening.
 - A. Members (no more than 25) must volunteer to rake their Loop and will be selected on a first-come-first-allowed basis, previous work history, and Park needs.
 - B. Loops B and D can have two Member volunteers removing needles.
 - C. Members on Loops without a Comfort Station must volunteer to rake a common area assigned by the Park Manager in addition to the Loop road.
- II. Member volunteers:
 - A. Are not allowed in the Park overnight until the last full weekend in April;
 - B. Must sign or already have in their Site File a Tahoe Timber Trails Association Liability Release Agreement – Volunteers (FM-11-13);
 - C. Must sign a pre-Park Opening Agreement (FM-17-23) that states:
 - no fires will be allowed;
 - Park Security is not available;
 - volunteers may be asked to leave due to impending bad weather;
 - work agreement/overnight staying may be rescinded by the Park Manager at any time.
 - D. Must agree to rake pine needles from a specific "adopted" Loop, consisting of the Loop Comfort Station and the entire Loop Road (including a "rake-wide" area shoulder on each side of the Loop Road) and;
 - E. Will not add their site needles to the ones raked up for the Park.
- III. In return for volunteering, Member volunteers may stay the weekends (or any other 2 consecutive nights in a week) from their first time working up to the normal Park opening.
- IV. The Park Manager will inspect the work volunteers accomplishments and have responsible volunteers correct any missed areas.
- V. Members wishing to volunteer for cleaning Loops of pine needles must contact the Park Manager of their wish to volunteer before the 31st March of each year. The Manager will make his worker choices and notify all who have volunteered.
